## Our researches focus mainly on:


- Immunology, including the detection of immune diseases and options of treatment, chronic inflammations, infections and allergies, autoimmune diseases and tumours.
- Tumour biology: studying carcinogenic mechanisms and the development of new therapeutic methods for oncology diseases
- Prevention of vascular diseases, together with the prevention of cardiovascular diseases and thrombosis research. With more than 17,000 participants, the Gutenberg Cardio Study is considered as one of the largest studies worldwide,
- Neuro-sciences including the main areas of neurodegeneration, neuro-regeneration, and sensory systems
- Minimally invasive surgery and researching the use of biomaterials, tissues and cells in surgery

Continuous and close interdisciplinary exchange between the different fields of research always takes place.
